

Fourth-generation railroader's power play for kids

Scott Eustace, a conductor/locomotive engineer, joined CN in 1985. He has been playing hockey since childhood, and knows that teaching children essential life lessons through sport is a great way to build good citizens. When his son Zach, 7, decided last year that he wanted to get on the ice, Scott leapt at the chance to coach for the Riverview Minor Hockey Club in Riverview, NB, across the river from Moncton.

Scott is usually on the ice twice a week with his 18 players, and enjoys seeing their skills improve week after week. "These kids are just so excited, and seeing them happy and having a good time developing friendships with their teammates is incredibly fulfilling."

CN's grant to the community hockey league - where 400 neighbourhood families play - will help defray costs to families in need, says Scott.
