IBEW Strike Update

The International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers (IBEW) has failed to respond to CN's latest offer to resolve the ongoing strike, now in its 10th day. The Union did so without putting the offer to its membership for a vote. CN had extended the offer until Tuesday, June 28 at 11:59 pm ET. As the parties did not reach an agreement by the deadline, and as a result of the ongoing strike, CN has removed its offer to provide a retroactive wage increase to January 1, 2022. Under CN's current offer, any wage increase will take effect on the date of a new collective agreement.

We urge the Union to return to the bargaining table with the objective of reaching a negotiated settlement or alternatively, to send all matters in dispute to binding arbitration.

On June 20, CN Executive Vice-President and Chief Operating Officer Rob Reilly sent a letter to all employees represented by the union to inform them of CN's offer at that time.
