Alan R. Abraham Jr. Atlantic Community Board Chair



Al Abraham, of Halifax, NS, was appointed Vice-President of the Environmental Services Group in 2017. Mr. Abraham has 30 years of experience in the waste removal industry. He founded Green Waste Systems in 1989 and grew it into the second-largest waste removal company in Atlantic Canada

before it was purchased by the Royal Environmental Group in 2010. Prior to entering the waste removal industry, Mr. Abraham held executive positions in both Nova Scotia and New Brunswick in the moving, storage and warehousing industries following graduation from Saint Mary's University. Mr. Abraham was active with industry associations, serving on their Board of Directors as well as the Fredericton Chamber of Commerce and Better Business Bureau of New Brunswick. Mr. Abraham currently sits on the Saint Mary's University Board of Governors. In 1999, Mr. Abraham was appointed a Director of the Halifax Port Authority and was elected Chairman of the Board in March 2002
