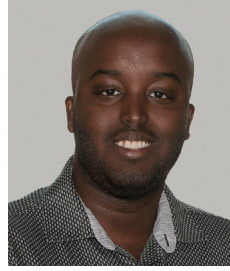
David Angus Winnipeg Community Board Chair

Jim held a series of increasingly responsible positions in Winnipeg, Edmonton and at CN Headquarters in Montreal. He retired as a Director responsible for media and community relations, major

incident communications management, and other duties across CN's North American network. In 2019, Jim came out of retirement to act as the CN100—A Moving Celebration media spokesperson. Prior to joining CN in 1989, Jim worked for the Canadian Broadcasting Corporation in Winnipeg, co-hosting Radio Noon from 1979 to 1984, and as a producer for CBC-TV's Country Canada from 1984 to 1989. Currently, Jim serves on the Boards of Directors of the Canadian Agricultural Safety Association's FarmSafe Foundation and CJNU Radio.

Dwight MacAulay, CVO



Dwight MacAulay, CVO is the recently retired Chief of Protocol for the Government of Manitoba where he served since 1998. He was also the Chief of Protocol for the Government of South Australia from 2006 to 2008. A native of Killarney, MB, Dwight attended Brandon University (Science) followed by a career in

radio and television news broadcasting before joining the Manitoba Government in 1980.

Dwight serves on numerous boards, including the 2023 World Police and Fire Games, St. John's Ambulance, the Royal Commonwealth Society, the Intrepid Society, Manitoba Music Experience, the St. Andrew's Society of Winnipeg, and the International Peace Garden.

Dwight has been personally honoured by Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II twice. Most recently in 2010 as a Commander in the Royal Victorian Order (CVO), the only Manitoban to ever receive this honour. He also presides over Canadian citizenship ceremonies and, to date, has sworn in well over 40,000 new Canadians. In addition, he was recently appointed as the Honorary British Consul for Manitoba.

A railroader with over 25 years of experience, David has worked in multiple locations across CN's network, including most recently as General Manager of Operations in British Columbia. David first joined CN as a management trainee and

Dayna Spiring is President and CEO of Economic Development Winnipeg Inc., which also encompasses YES! Winnipeg and Tourism Winnipeg. She also sits on the board of directors of the CancerCare Manitoba Foundation, is Honorary Colonel of 2 Canadian Air Division, and was Chair of the 2022 United Way Winnipeg

campaign. Dayna is also on the board of directors of Winpak Ltd. and previously served as Chair of the Winnipeg Football Club's board of directors. She is the first woman to have her name engraved on the Grey Cup and the second woman to serve on the Canadian Football League's board of governors.

In 2015, Dayna participated in the Directors Education Program within the Rotman School of Management at the University of Toronto, obtaining the ICD.D designation.
