

Forest Products

The bustling ports of Vancouver and Prince Rupert are dynamic gateways to international trade, offering shorter transit times to Asia. At the Port of Vancouver, we have coal, grain and intermodal terminals. In the Vancouver area, we have two distribution centres for forest products, two for metals, two for automotive products, and a CN CargoFlo® bulk handling centre. In Prince George, we have another intermodal terminal and another CargoFlo® bulk handling facility in Ashcroft. Surrey is home to a major rail classification yard. CN also maintains large railcar and/or locomotive repair shops at Surrey's Thornton Yard, in Prince George and in Kamloops.

In June 2022, SM Line began a new weekly service call at the Port of Prince Rupert. Together with our partner, DP World, CN is focused on enabling quick, efficient service to markets throughout Canada and the U.S.

Network Investments

Over the past decade, CN has invested more than \$3 billion to build and maintain a safe and efficient network in BC and to support our supply chain partners. Expansion projects included the construction of new and extended sidings as well as doubletracking sections of our main lines to the ports of Prince Rupert and Vancouver. Maintenance projects focused on the replacement of rail and ties, plus upkeep of crossings, bridges, culverts, signals, and other track infrastructure.

Community Partnerships

In 2022, CN contributed to many BC-based causes, including:

BOOTHROYD INDIAN BAND CN helped the Boothroyd Indian Band in Boston Bar acquire a flowmeter to support their climate change research along the Fraser River as well as guide environmental management and protection measures in the community.

HEALING THE HOOP The McLeod Lake Indian Band and Lheidle T'enneh Nation hosted a three-day wellness and reconciliation gathering in Prince George. CN sponsored the "Healing the Hoop" event that centred on an holistic decolonized approach of addressing relational, family and community health and wellness.

FORT ST. JAMES SEARCH AND RESCUE SOCIETY
The volunteers at FSJ SAR help find missing or lost persons and provide support for medical extrications, natural disasters, body recoveries, and wildfire evacuations. CN donated toward their purchase of a building to serve as a base of operations and to store equipment.

FORT ST. JOHN HOSPITAL Through the BC Community Board, CN contributed toward the purchase of Broda chairs, which are mobile seats that provide a safe, comfortable option for patients to move about in a seated or prone position. The chairs allow even the most bedridden patients to more easily socialize with others, which is very important in the healing process.

PORT EDWARD HISTORICAL SOCIETY CN contributed toward the conversion of an underutilized boat repair shop into a new community arts space, which hosts one artist residency annually as a means of better engaging local audiences, particularly among the local First Nations community. In 2022, the first artist to be hosted is internationally celebrated Northwest Coast woodcarver and sculptor Dempsey Bob, a member of the Tahltan and Tlingit First Nations.

YWCA METRO VANCOUVER CN sponsored the YWCA's Women of Distinction Awards, which recognize outstanding women and organizations in the community. The awards also support vital YWCA initiatives that help lift women and families out of poverty, provide the best start for children, and create new opportunities for education, employment and leadership.
