

# lowa





Through our subsidiary, the Chicago, Central & Pacific Railroad, CN's rails stretch the breadth of Iowa, from the Missouri River in the west to the Mississippi in the east. We carry a wide variety of manufactured and industrial products like food, machinery, electrical equipment, chemical products and primary metals. In addition to serving local businesses, CN's ethanol franchise is centered in the Hawkeye State with several plants along the route between Dubuque and Sioux City and Council Bluffs. The largest rail yard and facility on CN's Iowa network is in Waterloo.

In March 2025, CN and the Iowa Northern Railway (IANR) officially joined operations. With the closing of this transaction, CN and IANR are integrating their two railroads to better serve customers, the Iowa economy and communities along the network. IANR serves upper Midwest agricultural and industrial markets with 175 route miles and about 100 employees to deliver many goods, including grain, biofuels and fertilizers. This transaction supports the growth of local business by creating single line service to North American destinations, while preserving access to existing carrier options.

## **Network Investments**

Over the past decade, CN has invested about US\$280 million to build and maintain a safe and efficient network in Iowa and to support our supply chain partners. The program focused on the replacement of rail and ties, plus maintenance of bridges, crossings, culverts, signal systems, and other track infrastructure.

#### **Community Investments**

In 2024, CN contributed to several lowa-based organizations, including:

BLACK HAWK COUNTY Black Hawk County Public Health is responsible for emergency preparedness planning, training and response capabilities developed in coordination with local, regional and statewide partners. CN contributed toward the acquisition of public safety training equipment.

CEDAR RAPIDS PARKS FOUNDATION CRPF is focused on ensuring its parks are sustained properly and offer places to gather for friends and families. To that end, they are installing more shade structures in high-need parks. CN donated to support the Oak Hill Neighborhood Shade Shelter.

WATERLOO POLICE DEPARTMENT The Waterloo Police Department provides policing and community services to the citizens of Waterloo. The WPD Drone Unit enhances public safety, officer safety, and investigative effectiveness/efficiency. CN contributed to the purchase a drone designed to assist with the overwatch of a scene, search and rescue, natural disasters, high-risk incidents, etc.

NORTHEAST IOWA FOOD BANK The Northeast lowa Food Bank distributes nutritious food and grocery products to over 130 nonprofit organizations and programs that help families and individuals with food assistance. For 40 years, the Food Bank has alleviated hunger and provided nutrition education through its programs.

WAVERLY VOLUNTEER FIRE ASSOCIATION WVFA provides fire protection and rescue services to Waverly and surrounding areas. CN contributed to their community education program by helping to buy an inflatable firehouse. It is an effective educational prop to teach children and adults proper fire safety exit drills.

AMERICA IN BLOOM As part of our EcoConnexions From the Ground Up program, CN partnered with America in Bloom to promote beautification in Carter Lake by planting trees, shrubs and groundcovers.
