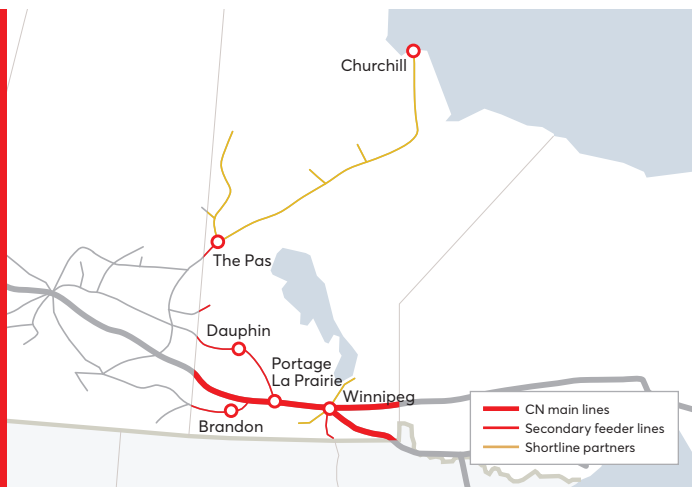

Manitoba is a major hub of CN's transcontinental rail network. Much of our traffic passes through Winnipeg's Symington Yard, our only hump yard in Western Canada. Winnipeg is also home to Transcona Shops, our main Canadian railcar and locomotive repair facilities, and our rail plant. Over 2,100 CN railroaders live and work in Winnipeg, where we also have CargoFlo® bulk handling and automotive distribution facilities, and an intermodal terminal.

CN's state-of-the-art Claude Mongeau National Training Centre in Winnipeg is focused on instilling and reinforcing a strong safety culture in our new hires, experienced railroaders and customers who received a complete range of hands-on technical training.

Manitoba is the only province to enact Rail Safety Week into law, a most significant accomplishment of which CN is very supportive.

Network Investments

Over the past decade, CN has invested over \$1.7 billion to build and maintain a safe and efficient network in Manitoba and to support our supply chain partners. Expansion projects included the upgrade of signaling and wayside equipment. Maintenance projects focused on the replacement of rail and ties, plus upkeep of crossings, bridges, culverts, signals, and other track infrastructure.



Community Investments

In 2024, CN contributed to many Manitoba-based organizations, including:

CHILDREN'S HOSPITAL FOUNDATION OF MANITOBA The Foundation helps children get the best care possible by funding leading-edge equipment, research, healthcare spaces, and programs at HSC Children's Hospital — Manitoba's only children's hospital. CN sponsored the 35th annual Teddy Bears' Picnic, an exciting day of family fun that provides kids with a developmentally appropriate understanding of what may occur in a hospital or research environment.

FESTIVAL DU VOYAGEUR CN sponsored this winter celebration, the largest francophone event in Western Canada, to promote *joie de vivre* and extend the reach of the French and Indigenous languages and cultures throughout the year through artistic, educational, historical and cultural experiences inspired by the voyageur era of 1815.

CN STAGE AND FIELD CN Stage and Field are the epicentre for many of Winnipeg's biggest outdoor celebrations. The CN Stage, a covered performance area, provides a concrete platform with built-in lighting, ideal for concerts and festivals. The CN Field is a vast green space that accommodates large crowds.

SKILLS CANADA MANITOBA ASSOCIATION To help meet the future needs of industry, Skills Canada Manitoba equips young students with the skills that will help Canada compete successfully in a rapidly changing world market. CN was a Platinum Partner sponsor.

MOUNTAIN VIEW SCHOOL DIVISION MVSD operates 16 public schools in Manitoba's scenic Parkland Region, which includes Dauphin, Roblin, Ochre River, Winnipegosis, Ethelbert, Gilbert Plains and Grandview. CN supports MVSD's Indigenous Land-Based Education program.

TREE CANADA CN partnered with Tree Canada to plant almost 8,000 trees across Manitoba, including for Winnipeg's Million Tree Challenge. These trees helped re-establish urban and rural forests, green communities, and recover areas with substantial tree loss to grow a greener future.
