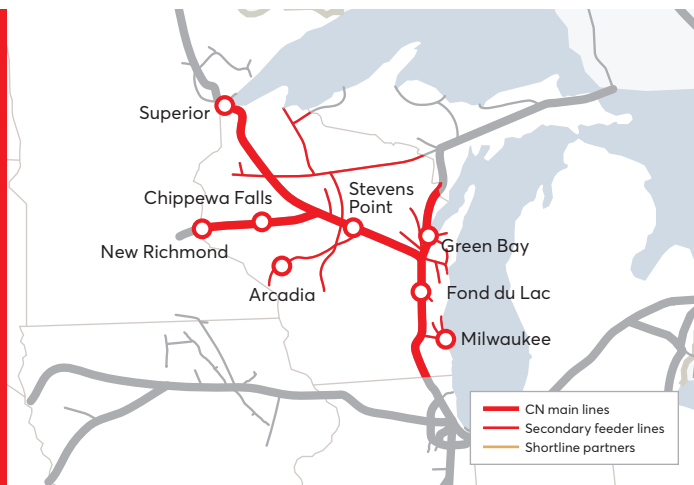

CN serves many local frac sand, forest product and general merchandise customers in Wisconsin, most notably from Milwaukee and Green Bay on Lake Michigan. We also have intermodal terminals in Chippewa Falls and Arcadia. Our two biggest rail facilities in the Badger State are classification yards in Stevens Point and North Fond du Lac. Stevens Point is the heart of CN's North Division and a key location on CN's main line between the U.S.-Canada border and Chicago, IL.

In 2021, we opened an automotive compound for finished vehicles in New Richmond, WI. The facility serves the growing needs of our customers in Minneapolis-Saint Paul and the Upper Midwest.

Network Investments

Over the past decade, CN has invested about US\$1.3 billion to build and maintain a safe and efficient network in Wisconsin and to support our supply chain partners. The program focused on network upgrades, the replacement of rail and ties, plus maintenance of Great Lakes Fleet vessels, bridges, crossings, culverts, signal systems, and other track infrastructure.

Community Investments

In 2024, CN contributed to several Wisconsin-based organizations, including:

BIG BROTHERS AND BIG SISTERS OF FOND DU LAC COUNTY As part of the nation's largest mentoring network, BBBS makes meaningful, monitored 1:1 matches between adult volunteers ("Bigs") and children ("Littles") ages 6 and up. BBBS develops positive relationships that have direct and lasting effects on the lives of young people in Fond du Lac County.

WEYAUWEGA POLICE DEPARTMENT The Weyauwega Police Department provides 24/7 law enforcement services to the community. CN supports their mission by helping to inform the public of the dangers of impaired driving. CN funded the acquisition of Fatal Vision alcohol simulation goggles. These work by shifting the wearer's equilibrium, making them struggle to walk a straight line as if impaired by alcohol.

FOND DU LAC COUNTY Fond du Lac County's foster care program helps ensure children's safety, health and emotional well-being by providing stable environments, supporting family reunification when safe, and seeking permanent homes, if needed. To raise awareness and support the foster care program, CN donated to their Breakfast with Santa event.

FOX CITIES FESTIVAL OF LIGHTS CN sponsored the Fox Cities Festival of Lights, an annual holiday fundraising event that takes place at Darboy Community Park in Harrison. This family-friendly event is a walk-through holiday light display set in the woods of the park.

THE SHARING CENTER The Sharing Center is Kenosha County's rural crisis and resource center, meeting basic needs and assisting families to become financially stable and independent. CN supported their Rural Nutrition Program.

AMERICA IN BLOOM As part of our *EcoConnexions From the Ground Up* program, CN partnered with America in Bloom to promote beautification in Rudolph and Glendale by planting trees and shrubs.
