Our operations support over 6,000 jobs in the province and add \$1.3M to Manitoba's GDP*

Manitoba is a major hub in CN's transcontinental rail network. Much of our traffic passes through Winnipeg's Symington Yard, our only hump yard in Western Canada. Winnipeg is also home to Transcona Shops, our main Canadian heavy railcar and locomotive repair facility, and our rail plant. More than 2,200 CN railroaders live and work in Winnipeg, where we also have CargoFlo® bulk handling and automotive distribution facilities, and an intermodal terminal.

CN's state-of-the-art Claude Mongeau National Training Centre in Winnipeg is focused on instilling and reinforcing a strong safety culture in our new hires, experienced railroaders and customers who received a complete range of hands-on technical training.

Manitoba is the only Canadian province to enact Rail Safety Week into law, a most significant accomplishment that CN is extremely supportive of.

Network Investments

Over the past decade, CN has invested over \$1.6 billion to build and maintain a safe and efficient network in Manitoba and to support our supply chain partners. Expansion projects included the upgrade of signaling and wayside equipment. Maintenance projects focused on the replacement of rail and ties, plus upkeep of crossings, bridges, culverts, signals, and other track infrastructure.

CN hosted Manitoba's Emergency Management Organization at its CN Training Campus in Winnipeg, as part of our ongoing commitment to educational opportunities for first responders.

Community Investments

In 2025, CN contributed to many Manitoba-based organizations, including:

CYCLE FOR HOPE CN contributed to Cycle for Hope, a fundraising initiative that supports affordable housing by helping raise funds to build homes for families in need.

FOOD SECURITY SUPPORT FOR NEWCOMERS Support from CN assisted with food security and essential relief items for newcomers, helping families access basic necessities as they settle into their communities.

NORTH POINT DOUGLAS WOMEN'S CENTRE CN partnered with the North Point Douglas Women's Centre, which works with women to strengthen their voices, create positive change, and foster meaningful community engagement.

TTR DUCK AND GOOSE CAMP CN supported the TTR Duck and Goose Camp through funding for duck hunting boats used for traditional harvesting and cultural teachings, helping preserve Indigenous knowledge and land-based practices.

MANITOBA INDIGENOUS SUMMER GAMES CN contributed to the 2025 Manitoba Indigenous Summer Games in Sagkeeng and neighbouring communities, promoting youth participation in sport and long-term athlete development for future provincial, national, and international competitions.

FESTIVAL DU VOYAGEUR CN was proud to support the Festival du Voyageur, Western Canada's largest winter festival, celebrating French-Canadian heritage and bringing communities together each February in Winnipeg's Saint-Boniface district.

CANADIAN AGRICULTURAL SAFETY WEEK (CASW) Through its community investment efforts, CN supported Canadian Agricultural Safety Week, a national campaign that raises awareness and encourages farmers, families, and agricultural workers to prioritize safe, healthy, and sustainable practices.
